Help available for past due bills, but funds are limited

A reminder that the state's <u>COVID-19 Arrearage Assistance Program</u> continues to offer financial assistance for overdue utility bills. VEC members, including commercial and industrial members, may be eligible if their balances are over 60 days past due and are attributable to economic hardship due to loss of income caused by the pandemic. Members should find out if they are eligible promptly and apply as soon as possible because funds are limited, and applications will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis. The program ends Nov 30. Find information and applications <u>here.</u>
